Your ability to follow our directions precisely and get your point across using only three pages is an important part of what we will be looking at when reading your application. Print your entries on the front page of this application and type your 3 pages of responses to the below 8 questions using a 10 or larger font, black ink, white single-sided 8.5 by 11 inch pages, single-spaced with at least 1/2 inch margins. Type your name at the top of all 3 additional pages. Staple all pages together.

You must submit the completed application front-page and your 3 response pages to your counselor so that she/he may verify the accuracy, integrity and content of your responses before they send it to us. Counselors are invited to comment confidentially if they wish.

YOUR ACTIVITIES: In a list format, using 1 single-sided piece of paper for all activities from the five categories below, list activities from your high school years only. Using 2 or 3 lines for each listing, name the activity, how much time you spent, positions you held, what you personally did and what you gained from the experience. Be brief and save your best grammar for responses to 6, 7 & 8.

List as many of your most important activities, related to the 5 categories below, as will fit on 1 piece of paper. Use the following examples of French Club and Wal-Mart as the models for each activity you list.

French Club, 2 years, Secretary during senior year. Helped arrange field trip to Monet exhibit. Wrote the club's constitution in French, spent a week speaking only in French. Gained increased appreciation for other cultures, will probably minor in French in college.

Worked at Wal-Mart 2 summers and part-time during school year. Stocked shelves and helped customers. Rounded up shopping carts and lost kids. Gained more respect for earning my own money and being reliable and I paid my own car insurance.

1. CREATIVE ACHIEVEMENTS (art, music, singing, writing, photography, intellectual pursuits, etc.)
